Early Childhood Gift Mailings






1,000,000 views and counting




OUTREACH

Exciting News!

Early in the new year, New Church Journey was approached by *The Dr. Oz show*, a morning television program with 3.5 million daily viewers, to provide short video content in support of a new segment of the show called "Faithful Fridays." The first show of this segment airs **February 3rd**. The Journey video team is in the production stages, and is collaborating with "NewChurchLive" and the Swedenborg Foundation's "Off the Left Eye." This collaboration is essential, and the hope is to use the platform of short videos to share spiritual insights to a much wider audience.

The Latest Small Group Series



Mindful Communication Challenge is a 5-week series about bringing love, wisdom, and use into our words to communicate more effectively. It draws on Jesus' Parables of Heaven in the New Testament that teach us how to create a more heavenly society here on earth. Last fall, we had 7 congregations running the program in North America. 10 congregations are running it internationally, including South Africa, Australia, and Togo in late winter/early spring.

Create: Make space for restorative practices is a new mini-series that runs 5 weeks, focusing on making an intention for those creative endeavors that help bring health and peace to our lives. In addition to scriptural readings, it features reflections from a number of New Church creative minds. Bryn Athyn Church is the first group running this, with a variety of focus-specific groups including quilting, drawing, and songwriting.

Strategic Plan Highlights | Participation

One strand of the General Church Strategic Plan (view full plan here) aims to expand participation and involvement in the life of the Church through two avenues--women and youth.

A 14-member **Women's Participation Task Force** have been exploring ways of inviting feminine wisdom and expertise more effectively into the life of the Church. We have looked at relevant teachings and considered such subjects as what "more effective listening" looks like. To be explored are the important topics of: what's happening or could happen around the church; how to work toward a more supportive culture; and ways to provide useful educational opportunities. We have a great group of dedicated individuals working toward a set of recommendations that we plan to share with board members and clergy at the clergy meetings in June. Your thoughts are important. The **Youth Task Force** was formed to engage youth in the Church. In considering what would be useful, and in having conversations with young adults, we are looking to allocate a portion of a minister's time to work with young adults. We anticipate doing this in cooperation with Bryn Athyn College of the New Church and the Academy Secondary Schools. The goal is to provide programs for congregations who are working with young adults, develop direct engagement and communication, and create various events led by young adults, especially for those not living near a congregation.

Meet a Minister


Rev. Samuel Lompo hails from Burkina Faso in West Africa, our only General Church minister in that country so far. He was ordained into the first degree of the priesthood in August 2013. In fact, he graduated from theological school, got ordained, and got married all in the space of two days! He has since started a church in Ouagadougou (pictured), bought a plot of land with GC assistance, and started a church building on it. He has written a book of basic beliefs of the New Church as a part of his evangelization efforts, and has since been ordained into the second pastoral degree. He and his wife, Stephanie, have a beautiful daughter named Jemima.
