
Two Episcopal Ordinations

As many within the General Church are aware, I recently had the privilege of ordaining two colleagues into the episcopal degree of the priesthood. The ordination of the Rev. Bradley D. Heinrichs took place at the Carmel New Church and School in Caryndale, Ontario on January 13 (viewable here). The ordination of the Rev. David H. Lindrooth took place at the Bryn Athyn Cathedral on January 20 (viewable here). I couldn't be happier with how the services went. Both were well attended and had a wonderful sphere to them. A highlight was the declaration of faith and statement of purpose of each of these priests. It was also rewarding to see the outpouring of support for Brad and Dave, and for the Church. I was personally touched by the acknowledgment of Cathy Heinrichs and Aven Lindrooth by my wife, Teresa, after each service. I very much look forward to working with these two people when I take office as Executive Bishop in July.

A next step is the vote of affirmation by the General Church membership of the nomination of Brad and Dave to serve as Assistant Bishops. They can only hold this title if they are affirmed by the Clergy, the General Church Board and the General Church membership. The first two groups have affirmed them. We intend to send affirmation ballots to all General Church members on or about March 21, utilizing the same email and physical mail system used for my affirmation vote. **Members: if you believe that we do not have an updated mailing address or email address for you, please send that information to** susan.wright@anc-gc.org or call (267) 502-4990. On January 12th, it was my honor to dedicate the new church building for the Seoul New Church congregation. David Frazier, executive director, also attended to show support for their accomplishment. This new building is the result of tremendous effort by the society in Seoul. They created a facility that will serve the New Church in Korea both now and into the future using locally donated money and then doubled by our Healthy Church Match program, and the sale of their previous building. It will also become a center for the development of the New Church in all of Asia.

The dedication service had over 70 people in attendance. This included friends from the southern congregation in Kwangju. The Rev. John Jin, the Regional Pastor, and I were on chancel for the service. After opening the old copy of the Word, John read lessons in Korean. A leading layperson brought forward a new copy of the Word, and I pronounced the words of dedication and placed it in on the altar.

This new building has produced excitement and hope. May this truly become a beacon of the New Church, a shining light for people to find the Lord God Jesus Christ and the life that stems from His truths. Pastor Soon Cheol Lee and the congregation are to be congratulated.

Our lives have been blessed while serving since 2010 at the New Church Buccleuch, just north of Johannesburg, with a vibrant congregation and beautiful property.




Mid-year Fundraising Progress
