General Church Education has developed a series of new easy-preparation video-based lessons for teens. FaithBuilder offers a total of 120 lessons for ages 12-16, suitable for Sunday schools, families and classrooms. Lessons include New Church background, warm-ups, video links, varied discussion questions and more. Lessons take 20-30 minutes. Years 1, 2, and 4 explore core New Church ideas such as the Lord, Divine providence, marriage and eternal life. Year 3 is an in-depth study of the Gospel of John. 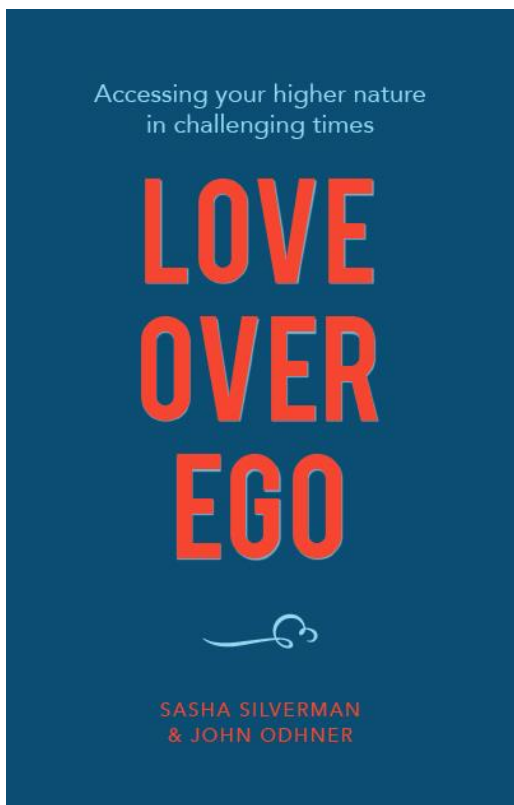
Connecting with Newcomers

Newchurch.org continues to increase its reach by more than 30% compared to 2016. For example, 2017 had a total of 297,461 users compared to 214,155 in 2016. They continue to have conversations with readers who write-in. The most common topics surround forgiveness, loss of a loved one, anxiety and grief. 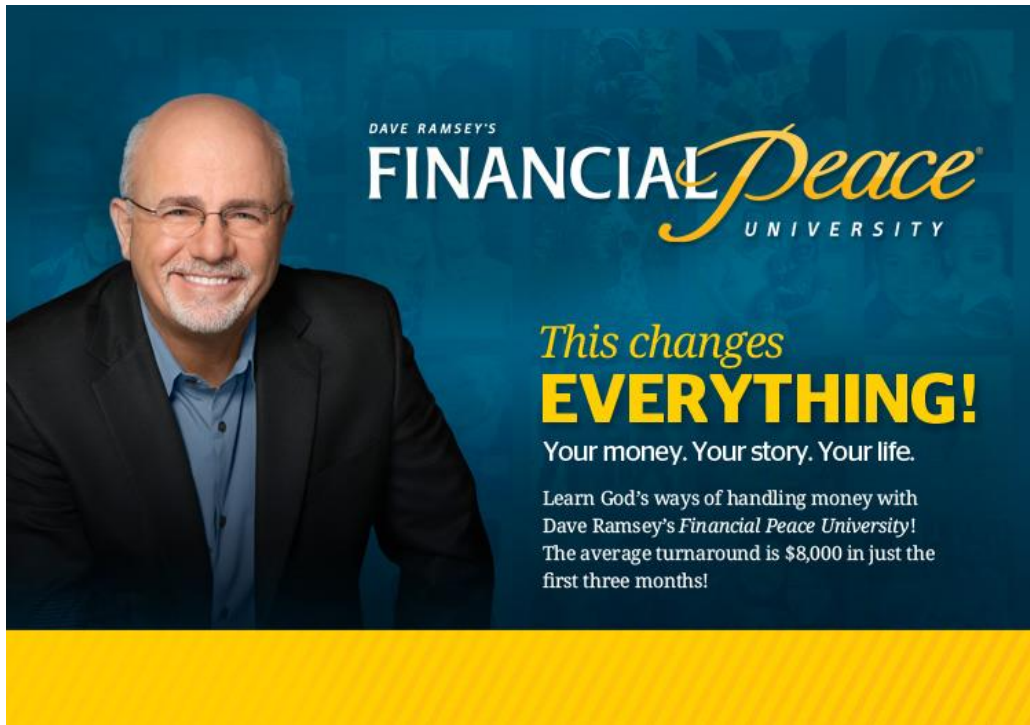
- Erik Buss, Assistant Pastor of Bryn Athyn Church

New Church Spotlight | Bryn Athyn Church

The **Bryn Athyn Church congregation** began offering **Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University** class three years ago. This life-changing program teaches families and individuals how to handle their money through Biblical, common sense principles and small group accountability. As they work on a total money makeover, the average family pays off \$5,300 in debt and saves \$2,700 in the first 91 days after beginning FPU and is completely out of debt, except for the mortgage, in 18 to 24 months.

As people walk through FPU together, marriages are healed as couples get on the same page about money, parents learn how to teach their children about money, singles are kept accountable to responsible money management, and relationships within the church grow.
