

As we entered Fiscal Year 2021, the immediate global impact of COVID-19 left many questions and uncertainty of what the year would hold. Despite the potential for an adverse outcome, we are grateful for many blessings that allowed us to continue supporting our congregations and schools. We are pleased to report a positive financial position at the close of the fiscal year. The following are key takeaways from our financial results for the year ended June 30, 2021 (unaudited):

- We exceeded our Annual Fund goals for the fourth year in a row for all categories, dollars, number of donors, and number of gifts. As with FY20, we experienced lower costs for travel and the unfortunate cancellation of many scheduled events, such as the clergy meetings and the Retreat, ending the year with an operating surplus over \$600k.
- ▶ We directed some of the financial resources from FY21 to address an increased demand for digital engagement during the pandemic, by enhancing our online presence in meeting peoples' worship needs.
- ▶ The approximate \$2.2m loan from the federal Paycheck Protection Program was distributed to the benefit of eleven participating congregations and schools with need throughout the US. This Program benefitted people by maintaining paychecks to support their lives, and helping continue various General Church uses. Subsequent to the financial year close we were granted forgiveness of the loan.
- ▶ The NCIF had a strong performance with year-over-year net returns of 23%. Net returns are after all General Church operational uses were supported.


