

Friends,

I am excited to reach out to you in this new format to share some of the ways the Church is striving to enhance your spiritual journey. I hope that the things in this and subsequent newsletters engage you where you live, and stimulate your participation in an ongoing dialogue of what we're here to do together as a church.

One of the things I have been working on is communicating what we stand for and what we offer. I see a wonderful mission under the theme "living a heavenly life"—or of striving to live that life with the Lord's help.

While studying this theme, I have come across three invitations from the Lord in terms of that life that He calls us to live: an invitation to help others or to be useful, an invitation to consider our next step in terms of repentance or life change, and an invitation to actively connect with Him through worship. These three foundations of a heavenly life, then, should be our focus as a church.

CONNECTING TO SCRIPTURE




Genesis 1:3 - And God said,

CULTIVATED THOUGHT IN NEW CHURCH LIFE





TEN COMMANDMENTS CURRICULUM LAUNCH

General Church Education is excited to release a series of 11 lessons for ages 3-14, beginning with an introduction on how the commandments were given at Mount Sinai. Each commandment is taught through a story in the Old or New Testament, carefully chosen to model the commandment's message, illustrating both the negative effects of breaking a commandment and the positive effects of keeping it.

While each lesson includes readings and activities that target three different ages groups, the opening and conclusion of each lesson brings all ages together. These print-and-go lessons include short teachings from the Writings for teacher background, use readily accessible materials for the projects and activities, and are easy to teach from using the color-coded overview chart showing all the options. Teachers or parents can choose what will work best with their children.
