

During FY22 we focused resources on three strategic objectives: vision casting through strategized communications, strengthening organizational infrastructure, and improved employee development. In addition to the implementation of these long-term strategic objectives, each function within the central office continued to provide ongoing operational services, such as support for New Church Education, Outreach, Translation, Finance, HR, and Advancement. We believe these mission services are critical to our functioning as an organization and provide a foundation for each of the strategic goals. Below we share some of the ways our team obtained and deployed resources to support worship, congregations, New Church schools, small groups, and more.


- ▶ Revenue was supported by more than three quarters of a million dollars of unrestricted contributions to our Annual Fund from donors to church uses and fellowship in the Word. Additionally, income of approximately \$3.4M was generated from our investments.
- ▶ We are fortunate to have a healthy endowment and have benefitted from very strong market performance in FY21. However, FY22 has seen quite a change toward the negative, driven by increasing inflation, weakening market sectors and world events (Ukraine). Despite the recent downturn, our net assets, down approximately \$14M, ended the year at about \$159M, after all uses (payouts) and covering for inflation.
- During FY22 we spent approximately 5% of our operating budget on strategic offerings by elevating the Bishop's voice through newsletters, creating communication videos and sending out digital cards. In addition, we bolstered our support of employee development.
- About 9% of our budget was spent in support of New Church education through curriculum development and training teachers, as well as development and distribution of books for children, such as one on the Ten Commandments.
- ▶ Outreach efforts accounted for roughly 14% of our budget where we continued to reach people through short videos, social media, and facilitating small group participation.
- We spent about 16% of our budget outside North America. In March more than 20 people from eight different countries gathered in Ghana for regional treasurers meetings to discuss ways to support congregations and schools on the African continent.

Letter from Bishop Buss-

The past church year might usefully be characterized as an endurance run. Such a race is spoken about in Psalm 19, a psalm about the glory of the Lord or about His truth that is embraced by good people. "In them He has set a tabernacle for the sun, which is like a bridegroom coming out of his chamber, and rejoices like a strong man to run its race...." (vs. 4-5, cf. *Prophets and Psalms* 269).

Building on this analogy, the church has been striving in many ways to orient all of us around the teachings of the Lord's Word, helping us to see that "the law of the LORD is perfect, converting the soul" (vs. 7). As this publication indicates, worship services, teaching in schools, and church-related events continued, with many people actively engaged and served. I pray that you experienced episodes of closeness to the Lord in worship, advancements in your faith, and support for your efforts to live a principled and useful life.

An endurance run, however, also indicates a test — a difficult challenge. This past year saw the church facing an intense debate around marriage-related issues. It escalated in the months after the publication of my article in the January/February issue of *New Church Life* titled, "Standing for Marriage in Today's World"— an attempt to address an already-present subject which was causing strife within the church. As most know, voices of concern and support were raised in a variety of forums, culminated in a petition asking for greater consideration of those in the LGBTQIA+ community.

While challenging, I ask that we consider two foundational New Church principles that come into play during intense times. One is personal engagement in the Word, and another is the prompt to consider personal beliefs and values. The same two dimensions can apply to the church as a whole — our collective will to be led by the Word, and to consider how we will showcase heavenly values as we do so.

It has been an intense year in some respects, but one in which the hand of the Lord's providence has been in evidence. I invite us all to consider the final words of Psalm 19, thinking of them as a prayer for ourselves and wishing them on the church as a whole: "Let the words of my mouth and the meditations of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O Lord, my Rock and my Redeemer" (vs. 14). Thank you for your participation in and care for the church.


New Church Career Network

GENERAL CHURCH EDUCATION

GCED published an 11-part lesson book on the Ten Commandments for children 3–14. Copies were donated to all GC elementary teachers and were used at the Jacob's Creek Family Camp in 2022.





More than 2000 gifts were sent to families for Christmas, Easter & New Church Day. The Religion and English/Language Arts curriculum updates were completed and made available to teachers.

SOCIETY MILESTONES

Australian New Church

Hurstville New Church in suburban Sydney, Australia, celebrated the 100th anniversary of its church building in November 2021. Local historian Margaret Horner notes: "this [1921] was a huge year for the Hurstville Society because from having no permanent place of worship a block of ground was purchased and a simple building erected. The cornerstone was laid in July 1921 on the 16th anniversary of the Hurstville Society."

New Priestly Leadership Positions

Rev. Martin Gyamfi has the honor of being our first full-time Regional Pastor within the General Church. He has served as pastor in Asakraka, Ghana, and has worked to coordinate with pastors throughout the West Africa subregion. He has handed off his pastoral role to allow for most of his time to go toward supervising and supporting other pastors.

Clergy Meetings

For the year 2021, clergy meetings were planned regionally; sessions held August 16-19 and September 20-23 were designated for North American clergy. European clergy met from October 25-27, and West African clergy meetings were held from November 9-11.
