Friends,

I find it helpful to consider why the church exists and why the Lord invites us to participate. The purpose of the church stems from the Lord's greatest intention for all humans: that we are prepared by Him for the life of heaven. The church is a community that is intended to reflect heaven on earth – or at least as much as possible given that we as people are flawed, imperfect and not very practiced at being angelic! Still, it is a place where people should be able to enjoy something of the life of heaven. By extension, it is a community that can share the goodness of that life with others.

For the community to reflect heaven, we as participants need to learn how to interact with each other like angels. Living like an angel requires some knowledge of what heaven is like – it requires that we know what angels like to do and why they choose to do what they do. This is where the Word comes in. The Word is the source of information from the Lord about how to live like an angel. You could say it is an instruction manual (of sorts) on how to be an angel. The Word also provides contrast on the unfortunate consequences of what life can be like when reject that information in favor of living for ourselves and our own materialistic purposes. Since heaven is a higher dimension than our worldly plane, the information about heavenly life needs to come to us from a heavenly source (New Jerusalem and its Heavenly Doctrines #107).

Heaven is an environment of indescribable happiness, true peace, and deep love. The New Church can reflect that. The origin of that happiness is the love that constantly streams from the Lord, and truth is the body that surrounds that Love like its soul. Truth is therefore the form that the Lord's goodness takes allowing us to see and experience it. Why is this important? Because the Lord's life flowing into heaven is what makes heaven "heaven". It is also what makes the church alive. The purpose we are invited to embrace in the church is to engage with the Lord, reaching for His truths and seeking to understand how they teach us to share heaven with others. The New Church is therefore a community that is unique in its heavenly origin. All are invited to participate in the life offered through the truths of heaven, and we hope to walk alongside each of you on the path towards the Lord's heavenly peace.
